

Paul G. Quie, MD



Paul Quie was born in Dennison, MN on February 3, 1925. He received his BA from St. Olaf College in 1949 and his MD from Yale Medical School in 1953. He did his internship at Minneapolis General Hospital (1953-54) and his residency in Pediatrics at the University of Minnesota University Hospitals (1954).

From 1955-57, he served as a medical officer in the US Navy. In 1957. He returned to the UMN as a research fellow and as Chief Resident in Pediatrics. He served on the faculty of the Department of Pediatrics from 1958-1999 and was Chief of Staff at the University Hospitals from 1979-1984.

From 1962-64, he was a guest investigator at the Rockefeller Institute in the laboratory of James G. Hirsch. He became the first

director of the Biomedical Ethics Center in 1985.

Dr. Quie headed the Division of Pediatric Infectious Diseases for many years and from 1998 through 2014, Co-Directed with Dr. Phillip Peterson, the International Medical Education and Research Program of the Medical School.

He is currently Regents' Professor Emeritus of Pediatrics and Distinguished International Professor.
